Rosemary and Derek said they have a few nesting birds in their garden and wood: Great tit in a camera box with 5 chicks, viewed on a T.V.; Blue Tit with chicks in a box above their conservatory; Long-tailed Tit in a bush but don't think eggs have hatched yet (not enough adult activity); 4 Robins collecting live meal worms but their nests are not in our garden; new tree hole in a dead pine which may be Woodpecker; Nuthatch around and will try to find its nest hole; Coal Tit may be nesting in our ivy. So plenty to watch for those who want to sit and stare! Derek will take walkers around the Broadstone Nature Reserve instead of Canford Heath, where there are lots of tweeting birds and no traffic noise! Gravel Hill where we live is too dangerous to cross except via lights down the hill, sadly traffic noise can be heard for quite a distance.
