Buckler's Hard is a picturesque 18th century village in the civil parish Beaulieu, in the New Forest. Situated on the banks of the Beaulieu River, it is part of the 9,000-acre Beaulieu Estate. Our walk started from the car park, passing the Maritime Museum originally the village inn, then the apple orchard down to the high street with its two rows of Georgian cottages running towards the Beaulieu River. We passed by the Dukes Bath House now a holiday let, the boat harbour and the historic boat yard where ships for Nelsons fleet for Trafalgar were built. Walking the Solent Way footpath towards Beaulieu we passed Burt Oak Copse, taking a detour to walk around footpaths running alongside the river bank along with a visit to the bird hide, before we turned back it was raining very heavily. We had our picnic lunch on the green by the 18th century slipways where Nelsons fleet were launched, having to take shelter by the Shipwright Workshop built in 2014 as a reconstruction of traditional building methods to keep them alive, we all got soaked! Afterwards some of us then took a boat trip along the river estuary.
