## Fordingbridge and Bickton Walk

Date: 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2023

Fordingbridge is a town and civil parish on the River Avon in the New Forest District of Hampshire, near the Dorset and Wiltshire borders and famed for its late medieval seven-arch bridge, its known as the northern gateway to the New Forest. From the main car park we set off down the High Street, turning left into Provost Street which leads into Church Street. At the junction called the Quadrant there is a quarter circle of Almshouses. Walking on we came to the parish church of St Mary where we turned off to follow the Avon Valley footpath to Bickton, a small hamlet still within the parish of Fordingbridge. Along the way we passed a sewage works and a disused fish farm. The heronry we saw on our last visit seems to have gone, probably because the fish farm has closed since then. After crossing a bridge over the River Avon we reached Bickton Mill. A mill has existed at Bickton since the time of the Domesday Book. The current mill was built in the 18th century and has now been converted into apartments. We followed the lane north eastwards to meet the A338, the main road which runs between Fordingbridge and Ringwood. After we crossed this road we turned off to pass by Redbrook Farm, then walked across fields to reach Fordingbridge Cemetery on Stuckton Road where we then returned back to our cars.
