Milford on Sea Walk

Date: 13th August 2025

Our walk started from The Needles Eye Cafe car park in Hurst Road, Milford on Sea. We walked along Hurst Road passing the bird hide, then part of Hurst Spit which runs to Hurst Castle and alongside Sturt Pond a 10.9-hectare (27-acre) Local Nature Reserve, which is owned and managed by Milford on Sea Parish Council. It is part of Solent and Southampton Water Ramsar site and Special Protection Area of Solent Maritime Special Area of Conservation and of Hurst Castle and Lymington River Estuary, which is a Site of Special Scientific Interest. Sturt Pond itself is tidal and the reserve includes Dane Stream which runs through it, along with reedbeds, lagoons and saltmarsh. These habitats attract many birds and there is also an area of grassland which is grazed by New Forest Ponies.

After crossing a bridge over Dane Stream by now on its way to the sea we circled round walking alongside the pond back to reach Milford on Sea village. Its home to 14 acres of Ancient Woodland known as Milford Nature Walk or the Pleasure Gardens, we walked through it with its network of winding footpaths, grassland and with the Dane Stream running through it. The naure walk runs parallel to the coast and the length of the parish. We returned back by walking along the cliff tops.
