Millyford Bridge and its car park are located 2 miles west of Lyndhurst on the minor road leading from Emery Down to Bolderwood and Linwood. The bridge carries the minor road over Highland Water, a gravel-bottomed New Forest stream which meanders through the forest towards Brockenhurst and eventually becomes the Lymington River, which flows into the sea. Our study of Mosses and Lichens concentrated on the area surrounding Highland Water from the car park and into Holmhill Inclosure. Unfortunately after lunch it started to rain so the second part of study was called off.
