Our walk started from Oakley Forestry England car park on Lyndhurst Road which runs from Burley to the A35 and onto Lyndhurst. South Oakley Inclosure was created in 1853, it lies on what originally was mainly open heathland with scattered trees, although there were already areas of ancient, unenclosed woodland present with occasional pollarded trees, remnants of the original Oakley Wood that were spared the axe when the inclosure was created.

From the car park we started to walk down a very muddy ride, reverting to walking through the woods beside it which was much firmer, until we met the cycle track which runs from Woods Corner car park to Bolderwood. Walking along the graveled track passing an attractive area of broad-leaved woodland with scattered blocks of conifers, until we came to a tarmacked lane bordering Burley Outer Rails Inclosure. The lane leads to Old House to the north but we followed it to the south which leads to Lyndhurst Road, then walking along it we returned to Oakley car park.
