According to an information sign this ride (passage through a plantation) is dedicated to the memory of the naturalist Frederick William Frohawk (1861-1946). The Forestry England manages the Frohawk Ride for butterflies as part of their commitment to conservation of rare insects. Regrettably, we did not see as many butterflies as we would have liked.
