Toyd Down and Quarry is a 6.7-hectare (17-acre) biological Site of Special Scientific Interest east of Martin in Hampshire. Although predominantly farmland the down has many ancient barrows located there. It is situated within the parish of Martin Off Martin Drove End at the Tidpit junction.
