Wareham, a walk around the town walls

Wareham is an historic market town and under the name Wareham Town, a civil parish in the county of Dorset. The town is situated between the Rivers Frome and Piddle eight miles south-west of Poole.

Wareham Town Walls are a Scheduled Ancient Monument, owned by the Rempstone Estate and managed by Dorset Council. Originally built in Saxon times to defend the town from Viking attacks they surround the heart of the town on three sides and date from the 9th century. The Walls (now grassy, earth mounds) are managed to improve the local wildlife with 21 species of butterfly, 7 species of grasshopper and bush cricket, 4 species of reptile, 17 notable Dorset plant species all recorded along with many bird species.

The walk started from Connegar Lane car park following the Walls Walk passing the parish church of Lady St Mary and the Quay along West Walls then North Walls enjoying views of the Common and the River Piddle and beyond to Wareham Forest, continuing past the church of St Edward the Martyr, then onto East Walls and returning back to the car park.
